

Foreign Language Requirements in the CAA University System

UNC System in general by university and college or degree:

<u>Institution</u>	<u>Degree or College</u>	<u>Level of FL study required</u>
ASU	BS/BFA	None
ASU	BA	At least 6 hours through 212 or higher in a foreign language
ECU	BA	Through 212
ECU	BS, BSBA	None
ECSU	All	None, though the 111/112 sequence can count as part of a Literature and Language requirement of Gen Ed
UNCFSU	All	None, though the 1 FL course can count as part of a Global Literacy Gen Ed requirement or be required in a program
NC A&T	All	None
NCCU	All	Through 211 (testing placement higher than 211 exempt from FL)
NCSU	All Other Colleges	Two years same language in HS at C or better, transfer in two semesters of same FL in college, or placement into 211 by exam
NCSU	CHASS, PCOM	Through 211 or 212 depending on program of study
UNC-A	All	Through 112 or placement into 211 by exam
UNC-C	All	Foreign language requirement varies by program and major. Most majors require demonstrated proficiency through 112, 211 or 300 level by course transfer, completion, or testing by exam

UNC-CH	All	Through 211 (if placed into 212, must complete it)
UNC-G	A&S	Through 212
UNC-G	All Others	None
UNC-P	All	None
UNC-W	All	Through 112 if the language was not studied in HS, or through 211 if it was. If placed via testing into 211 or higher in a language studied in high school, student will have to take one additional course at the higher level. (but not if they transfer 211 to the college)
WCU	All	Credit for a single class offered as an option in the World Cultures part of the Liberal Studies section of Gen Ed
WSSU	All	None, though one course can fulfill the Globalization focus among the 7 areas required for Gen Ed
Private schools:		
Gardner Webb	BA/BS	Through 212
Gardner Webb	BSN/BM	Through 112
Lees-McRae	BA/BFA	Through 212
Lees-McRae	BS	None
Lenoir-Rhyne	All	At least two levels of FL

(If transferring before the completion of the AA or AS degree, and if MCR is not met with the high school transcript for students under 24 years of age, then students must complete two courses of foreign language in addition to all of the other MCR competencies in college to meet the university system entrance requirements)
