

## READMISSION/TRANSFER/ADVANCED ENTRY RESPIRATORY THERAPY APPLICANT ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Applicants with prior Respiratory Therapy (RT) credits from a diploma, associate degree or baccalaureate Respiratory Therapy program may be eligible for readmission/transfer/advanced entry. Applicants who have not successfully completed any curriculum Respiratory Therapy courses must apply for basic entry into the Respiratory Therapy program. Readmission/Transfer/Advanced Entry at any level beyond the first semester will be based on space availability, prior progression of coursework, and the following procedures:

### Eligibility:

Readmission applicants must have successfully completed at least RCP 110 and RCP 113.

Readmission applicants must begin the program within two years of having exited a Respiratory Therapy program. Applicants who exceed the two-year limit must apply as a new applicant for the first semester of the program (basic entry).

Readmission is defined as re-entry at any point beyond the first semester.

Advanced entry applicant must be credentialed and currently employed as a Certified Respiratory Therapist and have a minimum of five years of experience in respiratory care verified by his/her current employer(s). In addition, they must have completed an accredited one-year diploma program in Respiratory Therapy. An official transcript from each college, university, or post-secondary institution attended must be sent to the Student Services Office.

Applicants who have had two or more unsuccessful (withdrawal or failure) enrollments in a Respiratory Therapy program are not eligible for readmission/transfer/advanced entry (must apply for basic entry). Students will only be allowed to be readmitted one time in a RT program.

*Please Note:* If you are wanting to transfer or be readmitted into the final semester of the RT program, you will be asked to audit RCP 210 and RCP 214 during the fall semester before beginning the final semester of the RT program. This requirement will require you to meet fall Readmission/Transfer/Advanced Entry admission deadlines before being permitted to audit RCP 210 and RCP 214. Please remember, the ability to audit will be based upon meeting Readmission/Transfer/Advanced Entry admission requirements and space availability.

**Readmission/Transfer/Advanced Entry Deadline:** Applicants must submit an application to the Student Services Office and all admission requirements must be completed by the following deadline dates in order to be considered for readmission/transfer/advanced entry to the Respiratory Therapy program.

## Spring/Summer/Fall 2022 deadline dates for readmission/transfer/advanced entry include:

Spring Reentry Deadline Date: January 4, 2022

Summer Reentry Deadline Date: May 31, 2022

Fall Reentry Deadline Date: May 31, 2022

All admission requirements must be successfully completed by the applicable deadline date listed above in order to be considered for readmission/transfer/advanced entry to the Respiratory Therapy program for Spring/Summer/Fall of 2022.

# PART I: MINIMUM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The following steps must be completed. Please use this page to monitor your progress. These steps are numbered and detailed throughout the remainder of this information packet.

1. Completion of a WCC Application Indicating Respiratory Therapy as your Program of Study-Noting Readmission/Transfer/Advanced Entry
2. Prove College Readiness
3. Respiratory Therapy Information Session
4. Completion of High School Diploma or Recognized Equivalent
5. Submission of Official Transcripts
6. Required Courses
7. Successful Completion of a MAR Review
8. Successful Completion of the Respiratory Therapy Aptitude Test

### 1. Completion of a WCC application

Submit a WCC application for admission to the Respiratory Therapy program at <a href="https://www.wilkescc.edu/enroll/">https://www.wilkescc.edu/enroll/</a>. Applicants may only apply for two limited-admission programs in each academic year. WCC limited-admission programs include: Associate Degree Nursing, Dental Assisting, Emergency Medical Science, Radiography, Respiratory Therapy and Regionally Increasing Baccalaureate Nurses (RIBN).

## 2. Prove College Readiness

Applicant must be eligible to enroll in ENG 111 and MAT 143 without a co-requisite.

Applicants requiring special testing accommodations due to a disability must contact the Disability Services Office at (336) 838-6560 at least 10 working days prior to testing.

### 3. Respiratory Therapy Information Session

Attend a *mandatory* one-on-one Respiratory Therapy Information Session with Wendy Nichols to review the application process. You must complete an admission application for Respiratory Therapy before registering.

## 4. Completion of High School Diploma or Recognized Equivalent

High school diploma or recognized equivalent must be completed before entry into the program. If applying as a high school senior, submission of a transcript reflecting all high school coursework completed at the time of application is required. If admitted, a final transcript must be submitted prior to beginning the program that reflects additional coursework completed and the actual graduation date.

## 5. Submission of Transcripts

Respiratory Therapy applicants must submit official high school, GED or Adult High School and official college transcripts at each educational institution attended. An official transcript is defined as a transcript that is received by the Student Services Office in a *sealed envelope with the official school seal*.

### 6. Required Courses

Applicants must successfully complete the following required courses with a grade of "C" or better. The following two classes *must be completed or in progress before the applicant can schedule a MAR review date*.

- a) One year/credit of a high school biology *or* BIO 110 *or* BIO 111 *and* BIO 112
- b) One year/credit of a high school chemistry or CHM 130 and CHM 130A or CHM 151 and CHM 152
- Credit by exam will not be accepted for the required courses.
- Required courses must be successfully completed by the applicants MAR review date or the applicants MAR review will be cancelled.

## 7. Successful Completion of a MAR Review

When a student has met the minimum admission requirements, steps 1 through 6, they must contact the Health Sciences Admissions Advisor, Wendy Nichols, at <a href="wdnichols077@wilkescc.edu">wdnichols077@wilkescc.edu</a> or 336-838-6136 to schedule a MAR review appointment. This process is being used to verify that all the above criteria has been met and satisfied. A MAR review must be completed before arrangements for the Respiratory Therapy aptitude test can be made with the Program Director/Lead Instructor of the Respiratory Therapy program, Billy Woods.

## 8. Successful Completion of the Respiratory Therapy Aptitude Test

Any applicant seeking readmission/transfer/advanced entry after the first semester will be required to take a test of Respiratory Therapy aptitude. This test will cover all successfully completed coursework prior to withdrawal. Applicants will be required to meet minimal competency appropriate for the point of reentry. Applicants must contact Billy Woods, Program Director/Lead Instructor of Respiratory Therapy to schedule their exam after the MAR Review has been complete.

## PART II: RANKING/SELECTION PROCESS

## Completed during the MAR review

**1.** *GPA*: Grades from the following *most recently completed courses* (Section A and Section B and Section C) are used to determine a Grade Point Average (GPA) and the GPA is then converted into a point value (based on an educational record point table).

**Section** A – Required high school or community college courses:

High school biology or BIO 110 or BIO 111 and BIO 112
High school chemistry or CHM 130 and CHM 130A or CHM 151 and CHM 152

**Section B** – General education courses in Respiratory Therapy curriculum: Grades from any of the below general education courses that have been completed by the MAR review deadline date will be included in the GPA calculation.

BIO 163 – Basic Anatomy and Physiology
ENG 111 – Writing and Inquiry
ENG 112 – Writing/Research
PSY 150 – General Psychology
COM 120 – Intro to Interpersonal Communication
PHI 240 – Intro to Ethics

Section C – Successfully completed Respiratory Therapy coursework will also be included in the GPA calculation.

RCP 111 – Therapeutics/Diagnostics
RCP 112 – Patient Management
RCP 113 – RCP Pharmacology
RCP 115 – C-P Pathophysiology

### Please note the following:

- When considering high school and college courses, *the most recent grade* (*if a course has been repeated*) will be counted in the point system calculation.
- If BIO 163 (or an equivalent course) has been completed prior to entry into the Respiratory Therapy program, it must have been completed *within five years from the first day of re-entering the program*. Otherwise, the credits will be considered to have expired and will not count towards fulfilling Respiratory Therapy degree requirements and will not count in the Respiratory Therapy point system.

#### Program GPA Calculation:

- a) When calculating your program GPA, the required courses (Section A), the general education courses completed by the MAR review date (Section B), and successfully completed Respiratory Therapy coursework (Section C) are calculated.
- b) Grade points are awarded based upon the following scale:

Α	4 Grade Points
В	3 Grade Points
С	2 Grade Points
D	1 Grade Point
F	0 Grade Points

c) The grade points earned for the 2 required courses (Section A), and any general education classes completed (Section B), and successfully completed RT coursework (Section C) are tallied and divided by the total number of courses completed.

**PLEASE NOTE:** If an applicant has a "D" or "F" in any course within Section B, then the course will count in the point system, but will not fulfill Respiratory Therapy degree requirements, as a grade of "C" or higher is required.

**PLEASE NOTE:** Page 7 of this document notes general education courses and course substitutions that will be calculated to determine the applicant's GPA.

**PLEASE NOTE:** If an applicant has completed the two required courses (Section A) in high school or college with a grade of "C" or better, the applicant has met the admission requirement. However, if the student repeats the college equivalent for a course within Section A and receives a "D" or "F" then the most recent grade will count within the point system.

## Total Points for Ranking

Students with the highest points will be accepted. In case of applicants with the same number of earned points, the applicant with the earlier MAR review date will be ranked higher. If a tie still exists, the applicant with the earlier application date will be ranked higher.

### NOTIFICATION PROCEDURE

Accepted applicants will be notified by the program director. *Notification letters will be mailed to all alternates*. Applicants who did not meet the minimum requirements, were not accepted or declined admission and wish to be considered for the next available class must:

- 1. Submit a new application
- 2. Attend another information session
- 3. Complete all admissions requirements for that application year

## FOR ACCEPTED APPLICANTS ONLY

#### CPR/MEDICAL FORM

Applicants who are selected for admission to the Respiratory Therapy program must submit documentation of the following steps to the Clinical Education Coordinator by the first day of class:

- a. Evidence of current CPR certification (must be Basic Life Support [BLS] American Heart Association Healthcare Provider).
- b. Submission of the Wilkes Community College Student Medical Form which must be completed by a physician, physician assistant, or nurse practitioner. This form is given to you at the acceptance meeting.

**Please Note:** To maintain enrollment in the Respiratory Therapy program, a student must earn a "C" or better in all courses required for the degree. The first "D" or "F" earned will result in a student being withdrawn from the program.

## Notice of Criminal Background Check

Applicants admitted to the program will be required to submit criminal background checks and drug screenings as directed by affiliated clinical agencies. A criminal background check and drug screen is required by some agencies before clinical placements, which are necessary to complete the Respiratory Therapy program. Students who are unable to complete required clinical placements will be dismissed from the program for failure to make satisfactory progress. Individuals completing the Respiratory Therapy program are eligible to apply to take a licensing examination, which they must pass in order to receive a license to practice. The licensing board does require information regarding conviction of a felony and/or misdemeanor and/or current charges on the application for licensure and MAY DECIDE NOT TO LICENSE an individual based on the result of an investigation of those particular charges.

Be advised: When considering whether to admit an undocumented immigrant into a specific program of study, community colleges shall take into account that federal law prohibits states from granting professional licenses to undocumented immigrants. Applicants lawfully present in the United States shall have priority over any undocumented immigrant in any class or program of study when capacity limitations exist. *PLEASE NOTE*, these procedures comply with numbered memo CC10-26, which was published by the North Carolina Community College System on July 12, 2010.

**PLEASE NOTE:** If BIO 163 (or an equivalent course) has been completed prior to entry into the Respiratory Therapy program, it must have been completed within five years from the first day of re-entering the program. Otherwise, the credits will be considered to have expired and will not count towards fulfilling Respiratory Therapy degree requirements and will not count in the Respiratory Therapy point system.

Your faculty advisor must request that the substitution be made, and it must be approved by the Health Sciences Dean, Billy Woods. You should always consult with your advisor before taking a course other than the course required in the Respiratory Therapy program plan. You may be required to provide a course syllabus for courses other than the one required by your program.
